## May is the First National Carriage Month! What is going on?

### Connecticut Valley Driving Club and Litchfield Hills Driving Club Observe First Annual National Carriage Driving Month!

The Carriage Association of America and the American Driving Society, both national organizations for the promotion and preservation of horses and carriage driving, have designated this May as the first annual observance of National Carriage Driving Month.

**For their part, The Litchfield Hills Driving Club will be holding their May picnic drive at The White Memorial Foundation in Litchfield, Connecticut.** The Litchfield Hills Driving Club is a carriage driving club headquartered in Litchfield County but drawing members from all over the state and from as far away as New York, Massachusetts and Rhode Island. The club has been in existence for over 30 years with over 80 members ranging in age from teens to 90's. Interests range from national competition to local pleasure driving, with the overriding attention to the love of horses and the perpetuation of carriage driving. **As part of this observance, Connecticut Valley Driving Club will be participating in a weekend camping trip...** Northeast Recreational Drive & Campout: May 17-18, Reynolds Horse Area, Escoheag (260 Arcadia Rd: Exeter, RI) You must be a CVDC Club Member to participate, or a member of the other regional driving clubs for insurance reasons. ### Intro to Carriage Driving Clinic at Horse Power Farm

Again this year there will be an introduction to carriage driving clinic. The clinic will be held at Horse Power Farm in Turner, Maine on April, 20 in a large indoor arena with heated viewing room. Sterling D. B. Graburn is the owner of Kingsforth Hall Training Center in Bonifay, Florida. He was the highest ranking North American at the 2006 Singles World Driving Championships in Pratoni, Italy, and is the 2004 FEI Top Driver North American Challenge Single Horse Champion. He drives single, pair, tandem, unicorn, and four-in-hand, and is one of the few whips in North America who competes in combined driving with a tandem turnout.

Sterling offers private lessons for competitive and recreational drivers and is an excellent clinician for both singles and multiples. Beginner and advanced levels are welcome for one or more days. Individual lessons address issues specific to the horse and driver or team and can be conducted in the indoor arena, outdoor track, or on the public road. A limited number of stalls and/or paddocks are available for out-of town horses, and there is plenty of room to camp on the grounds. Participants are invited to gather together at night to share a meal, compare notes, and watch event videos. The clinic concludes with a potluck dinner with lots of good food, wine, and interesting conversation.

Fee: An hour with Sterling is \$100. Auditors are welcome for \$25 a day. A 50% deposit is required to reserve your spot and is non-refundable after April 15, if you do not participate.

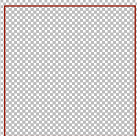
